

Behaviour Policy during the COVID-19 Outbreak

Annexe to Upper School and Prep School Behaviour Policies

During the period of site closure which started on the 20th of March 2020 in response to the Covid-19 outbreak the school will carry on teaching all pupils remotely, whilst also catering for key worker children on site. A phased reopening commences on 1st June, with more pupils returning to school on site.

During the site closure and phased return, the school's pupil Behaviour Policies (Upper and Prep) continue to be in force. Rewards and Sanctions systems remain in place as normal. Investigations into breaches of conduct may still be carried out as far as possible, remotely if necessary. Detentions will not take place in school, but if a pupil accrues enough concerns or warnings to convert to a detention, parents will be notified that in normal circumstances the pupil would be given a detention.

High standards of behaviour in online lessons are expected of all pupils.

In online lessons Pupils must not:

- Record any video or audio content
- Disrupt lessons in any way
- Make any statement – written or verbally – that is indecent, hurtful or out of line with our school values

Breaches of these rules could result in any level of sanction, including suspension or expulsion, in line with the severity of the offence.

For pupils on site during the phased return, it will be vital to follow the instructions on social distancing around the site in line with the school's published Risk Assessment. Any pupil deliberately or repeatedly breaking the rules may be sanctioned or excluded.
